Based on lab director interview and review of testing personnel education records, the laboratory did not ensure that laboratory testing personnel who attended a foreign school had an evaluation of their credentials determining equivalency of foreign to United States education. Findings: 1. A review of educational records revealed that 2 of 3 testing personnel hired after the previous CLIA survey on 5/22/2017 had diplomas from foreign schools. 2.
