<b>D5209</b>	<p><b>PERSONNEL COMPETENCY ASSESSMENT POLICIES</b> CFR(s): 493.1235</p> <p>As specified in the personnel requirements in subpart M, the laboratory must establish and follow written policies and procedures to assess employee and, if applicable, consultant competency.</p> <p>This STANDARD is not met as evidenced by: Based on record review and interview with the Office Manager the laboratory failed to perform competency evaluations on 2 (#C and #D) of 2 Testing Personnel (TP) performing Moderately Complex Testing for 2 out of 2 years (2018-2020) reviewed. Findings Included: Review of the CMS 209 signed and dated by the Laboratory Director on 02/10/2020 revealed that there were 2 TP (#C and #D) who performed Moderately Complex Testing (Potassium hydroxide and Scabies testing). Review of employee competency testing revealed no competencies for TP #C and #D. On 02/13 /2020 at 11:00 AM, the Office Manager confirmed no competency evaluations for TP #C and #D.</p>
