Based on a Proficiency Testing (PT) desk review of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) PT data report (Report 155D) and graded results from the American Proficiency Institute (API), the laboratory failed to achieve an overall testing event score of satisfactory performance for two (2) consecutive testing events for the specialty of parasitology for the analyte Giardia Antigen. The findings include: 1. A PT desk review of report 155D and graded results from API revealed the laboratory failed to achieve satisfactory results for the specialty of parasitology from API for the analyte Giardia Antigen.
