(b) Except as specified in paragraph (c) of this section, if a laboratory fails to participate successfully in proficiency testing for a given specialty, subspecialty, analyte or test, as defined in this section, or fails to take remedial action when an individual fails gynecologic cytology, CMS imposes sanctions, as specified in subpart R of this part. This STANDARD is not met as evidenced by:

Based on a Proficiency Testing (PT) desk review of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) PT data report (Report 155D), graded PT results from the College of American Pathologists (CAP) and an interview with the laboratory manager on 03/04/2026, the laboratory failed to successfully participate and achieve an overall satisfactory score for two (2) of three (3) testing events in 2025 for the specialty of routine chemistry. The findings include: 1. A PT desk review of Report 155D and graded PT results from CAP identified that the laboratory failed to achieve satisfactory performance for two of three events for the specialty of routine chemistry for the analyte bilirubin, total. Analyte Year Event Score bilirubin, total 2025 1 40% bilirubin, total 2025 3 40% 2. A telephone interview with the laboratory manager on 03/04/2026 at 9:53 am confirmed the above findings.
