(b) Except as specified in paragraph (c) of this section, if a laboratory fails to participate successfully in proficiency testing for a given specialty, subspecialty, analyte or test, as defined in this section, or fails to take remedial action when an individual fails gynecologic cytology, CMS imposes sanctions, as specified in subpart R of this part. Based on review of proficiency testing (PT) reports and records, the laboratory fails to achieve satisfactory performance for the analyte, white blood cell count, for two out of three consecutive PT events for unsuccessful participation. The laboratory received unsatisfactory performance scores of 20% for 2017 testing event 1 and 40% for 2017 testing event 3.

Based on review of proficiency testing reports and records, the laboratory fails to achieve an overall testing event score of satisfactory performance for two out of three consecutive testing events for the specialty, hematology. The laboratory received unsatisfactory performance scores of 76% for 2015 testing event 1 and 75% for 2017 testing event 3 for the specialty, hematology.
