Based on a review of the CASPER 155 report and performance evaluations from the proficiency testing organization College of American Pathologists (CAP), the laboratory failed to successfully participate in a proficiency testing program approved by CMS for the analyte: Glucose (non waived) which is in the specialty of Routine Chemistry in which the laboratory is certified under CLIA. The laboratory had unsatisfactory scores for the 2nd event of 2017 and the 1st event of 2018. Findings include: 1. CAP 2017 Event 2 for Glucose (non waived), the score was 0%. 2. CAP 2018 Event 1 for Glucose (non waived), the score was 0%.
