<b>D6051</b>	<p>TECHNICAL CONSULTANT RESPONSIBILITIES CFR(s): 493.1413(b)(8)(v)</p> <p>(b)(8)(v) Assessment of test performance through testing previously analyzed specimens, internal blind testing samples or external proficiency testing samples; and</p> <p>This STANDARD is not met as evidenced by: Based on review of College of American Pathologists (CAP) proficiency testing (PT) records and interview with the Practice Manager (PM), the Technical Consultant failed to assess Bacteriology test performance for 2 of 5 testing personnel (TP1 and TP2) in 2024 and 2 of 5 testing personnel (TP1 and TP3) in 2025. Findings include: 1. Review on 4/9/2026 of CAP PT records from 2024 and 2025 for presumptive identification of Group A Streptococcus (Group A Strep) revealed TP1 and TP2 failed to participate in PT for Group A Strep in 2024, and TP1 and TP3 failed to participate in PT for Group A Strep in 2025. 2. Interview on 4/9/2026 at 10:20 a.m. with the Practice Manager (PM1) confirmed the above finding and revealed PT is the only source of testing used to assess test performance of testing personnel.</p>
